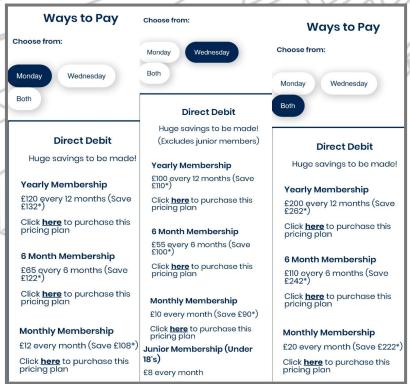

#### Chairman's Corner.....

This is the first of hopefully many articles, from myself, as chairman. I think it is vitally important that as a club, members are aware of the direction of the club and kept up-to-date. Equally, there may be something happening behind the scenes that people might not be aware of!

My first topic is numbers, and why are they important for the club!

As a club, to meet the school's booking requirements, we need public liability insurance and to be affiliated with Badminton England. There is a limit to the number of people registered with the club, to be affiliated with Badminton England, that are our insurance providers. We are limited to 49 people, and that includes all members, non-members and our coach. That might sound a lot, but in reality it isn't. Ideally, we need 24 members playing each night, to fill four courts and to have two spare members per court, to allow people a breather and to provide some different game permutations. So for both nights, that would be 48 players! That leaves no spare places, as Pete the coach has to have one!! In addition, to stay true to our club statement, we have to provide badminton for people that do not want to join and play on an adhoc basis, they attend as a non-member but need to be within this figure of 49. To maximise membership, we allow some members the opportunity to play both nights and we get members to commit to playing 70% of the time.

As a club, members have to commit to playing 70% of the time. The trick is to have enough members, so the courts are full but not too many, so members cannot book! The 70% works most of the time! We appreciate that members have lives outside of badminton and sometimes cannot keep to 70% commitment. All we ask is that members contact me. Hopefully, members that have made contact, will testify that I will always try to work with them, and if they cannot play for whatever reason, they can remain a member until they are back playing. Sometimes members are asked to leave or converted to a non-member, to allow the club to grow and to maintain full courts. This is always a last resort.

Although the majority of spaces are reserved for members and the majority of the perks including coaching are reserved for members, we do have spaces (usually 2 per session) for non-members most sessions. As mentioned, it is important that as a social club, we allow as many people to play badminton. The expectation is the club and non-member both provide a commitment to each other. Non-members don't have to let us know when they are not playing but if they can't attend for a while they let me know.

As a club, we are getting to that point where we will need to recruit some more members, as attendance has been dropping and we have had some players leave and some will be leaving shortly. This may result in some non-members that had not played for a while to leave the club but as always this will be the last resort.

I hope to see you all at Badminton soon, as numbers matter!

- We will shortly be updating our 'How to Play Badminton' document on our website please ensure you have a read so you are up to date on rules and etiquette of the Club
- Players helping clear away at the end of the night is **GREATLY APPRECIATED** we all want to get home!! A couple of asks if your court runs past or very close to the end of the session, please **DO** help clear away at the end (I think most do anyway :). Secondly, if you are moving posts around the Hall, please **DO NOT MOVE POSTS BEHIND AN ACTIVE COURT** a player moving at speed colliding with these posts could cause serious injury

- Please be aware of stepping on or near courts where there are games in progress keep to single file behind courts as close to the wall as possible.
- Be mindful of your positioning when at the net keep your racket up so you are able to return a shuttle, this will in turn protect your face and eyes
- Please ensure you are wearing clothing appropriate to play badminton in, paying particular attention to footwear if in doubt, please speak to a Committee Member
- Can all players please do their utmost to arrive on time late arrivals often means other players are not able to begin their games, thank you.
- Please can players respond to messages keeping in touch helps us run the Club smoothly and keep everyone in the loop
